





Obey parking regulations and signs or your car will be towed! Please also obey the "Clothes-Beyond-This-Point"

signs

 Pack out what you pack in and then some. Leave only your footprints and laughter! Leave your glass bottles at home! Bring only cans. Bare feet and broken glass don't mix!

 Show the public that nude is not lewd/rude. No overt sexual activity! Ask others, GVRD, or RCMP (604-224-1322) for help.

- Prevent destruction of driftwood and forest; fires are illegal, and destroy clean sunning spots! Respect high fire hazard restrictions.
- 6. Get nude! Respect nudity/ privacy of others and experience the joys of naturism! Gawking, staring, or making rude comments is <u>NOT</u> APPRECIATED! If nudity offends you, please check out Vancouver's many other beautiful beaches instead of mocking our naturist lifestyle. Please ask PRIOR permission to photograph, and NO photography of children. NO UNAUTHORIZED FILM-MAKING /photography, commercial or private.

 Use earphones when you are enjoying your radio or tape player. No generators, or loud amps, please! Wreck Beach was the first Vancouver-area beach to encourage use of

earphones!

- 8. Protect and respect wildlife and habitat such as seals (report but do NOT touch baby seals or the mother will abandon them), gulls, herons, eagles and rare, double-headed cattails in the estuary. Speak up for standards; if a person is unaware of the etiquette, please explain it quietly and politely. Take care of children; Know where they are and make sure they...and you... have enough water, shade, and sun protection (A minimum of SPF 15 is recommended). Know both your location and that of a sick / injured person on the beach if calling 9-1-1 for an emergency. Volunteer first-aid often at bottom of Trail # 6 or at the "Casino," midbeach.
- 9. Take due care and caution when swimming, skimboarding and boating; no lifeguards are on duty and irresponsible motorized vessels, jet skiers, and skim boarders DO NOT MIX with small children, swimmers, and kayakers who are not always easily visible. Motorized vessels are asked to respect the temporary line of white buoys designating the Pt. Grey swimming area by anchoring outside of them, or south of and behind the breakwater.

 Camping is illegal. RCMP/ GVRD patrol all summer. No dogs allowed on the beach between May 1 to Sept. 30, and you may be fined \$100. Dogs, crowds, and hot temps don't mix.







NOT ONE CM OR ONE INCH!

Judy Williams, Chair, WBPS

Prior to Wreck Beach being declared Canada's first legally-sanctioned clothing-optional beach within a regional park in 1991, nudity issues had been partially settled with the Beaupre vs Regina case of 1974. During that case, brilliant lawyer, Don Rosenbloom (of the Polish taser case fame in 2008) got the nude seven off by arguing remoteness, lack of prurient intent for simple nude sunbathing, and lack of public complaint. Since that case was resolved in favour of mere sunbathing nakedness, it set a precedent across Canada.

Fast forward to Bernice Gerard, hellfire and brimstone evangelical television preacher who tried to shame Wreck Beach hedonists into covering up. Her shaming walk in Summer 1976 had the opposite effect, and increased Wreck's popularity exponentially. Since then, numerous other landmark events and media coverage have focused international attention on Wreck, but one of the main threats came in 1985 when the RCMP announced plans to run a service road, to and along the very beach they wanted to patrol. This, of course, would have obliterated the beach they wanted to serve!

In August 1985, the Vancouver Board of Parks and Recreation was jammed with an overflow crowd of over 200 marching to Emilio's clown band on the lawns the day the road decision was to be made. Commissioner Helen Boyce claimed that Wreck Beach excluded all but a few nudists and that it was a park for everyone. She also said that it was the "enclave of a few." With all the television cameras rolling, when WBC Chair, Judy Williams held up Herb Mendt's 24" by 26" foamboard photo of thousands of Wreck Beach visitors, she brought the house down. Williams also quoted from Pope John "Love and Responsibility," 1981: "Because God created it, the human body can remain nude and uncovered and preserve its splendor and its beauty... The human body is not in itself

Commissioners voted against the road and for maintaining of the clothing-optional boundaries. This caused a standing ovation for Williams and her Wreck Beach Committee members who had prepared the presentation. We came very close to losing our beach to a road and to prejudice. What saved it was by pointing out the only thing that excluded folks from a clothing-optional beach was their own hang-ups! Right now, if you wish, you can hike naked from the Acadia section of Wreck Beach to the Musqueam Reserve along the foreshore as Nature intended!

shameful...Shamelessness (just like shame and

modesty) is a function of the interior of the person."

After 1987 when the GVRD took over stewardship of Wreck Beach and Pacific Spirit Regional Park, they implemented a task force of citizens and bureaucrats plus UBC and GVRD reps to iron out a

management plan for the park. This was a painful process for Wreckers because we were stereotyped as irresponsible and rag-tag hedonist hippies uncaring of environmental matters. Never mind that our mandate has been since 1977 to preserve Wreck Beach and surrounding cliffs and foreshore in as nearly a natural state as possible! The final push to save all 7.8 km if Wreck Beach for nude use (and the various sections of a linear Wreck are known as the estuary, Trails 6, 5, 4, 3 and Acadia) came in 1991 after a very long, uphill campaign by naturists worldwide. It was then that the GVRD Board voted to keep Wreck Beach clothing optional as had been declared by the Vancouver Board of Parks and Recreation. For years, naturists have quietly put up signs in some locations stating their preference of having nudists only next to where they were seated. With the advent of a growing population of textiles many of whom are from the University, more signs suddenly popped up in July. It isn't very pleasant being rated by immature men on a body beautiful scale of 1-10. Metro Vancouver has asked us to sit down with them over this next winter to address the disrespect shown by many clothed gawkers toward naturists or nudists. We fought long and hard for

our right to walk naked from one end of Wreck Beach to the other if you so choose. We are not prepared to bargain away even one cm or one inch of our beloved Wreck Beach which stretches from Point No Point to Spanish Banks! Please refer to the entire length of the beach as Wreck. The other names such as Acadia, Trail 4 and Trail 5 merely indicate sections of Wreck!! And, we walked the entire length of the beach to establish those boundaries with the AG! To counter the increasing number of gawkers, we have continued our Wreck Day sandcastle events, celebrated International Nude Week, implemented Acceptance Day (BAD), like Spain's A Day without a Bathing Suit, complete with BAM or Body Acceptance Machines with Naked Passports, participated in the Simultaneous Skinny Dip on July 11, and continue to try to encourage people positively to experience the joys of naturism. Here are just a few suggested signs Judy has conceived:

- The nude human body is not in itself shameful because God created it. Pope John Paul II
- Clothing Separates us from Ourselves- Margaret Mead
- 3) Clothed with the Sun!
- 4) "Dressed" as Nature Intended
- Body Acceptance is the Idea- Nude Recreation is the Way – TNS
- 6) Don't look now, but you're naked under those clothes!

Please remember if someone is not behaving lewdly or staring rudely, you should feel compassion for their being locked into their hot, sweaty clothes and just ignore them. Bets are on they will learn from example!

TRIBUTE TO LEE BAXANDALL, NATURIST SOCIETY FOUNDER AND MENTOR – 1935-2008

Lee Baxandall... Naturist Hero

From the time I first met Lee Baxandall in 1979, he took me under his naked "wing," so to speak, and mentored me in all things naturist. I admired his fiery and determined free spirit and multi-faceted life. From his love of art, theatre, and literature to his belief in freedom from censorship and government domination, Lee faced life headlong, fighting bigotry and close-mindedness every step of the way. Throughout the very beginning of the original naturist movement Lee fought for student and societal rights. Eventually, he founded the Free Beaches Documentation Center in his hometown of Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Its inaugural publication was called *Clothed with the Sun*, which is how I first discovered TNS. Lee and TNS became a source of great strength in the early years of our 40-year-plus battle to keep Wreck Beach in British Columbia both undeveloped and free.

I accepted Lee's invitation to my first TNS naturist gathering in the mid-80's at Lupin Lodge, outside of Los Gatos, California. Thus began many years of friendship as Lee, through the Naturist Society, mentored us through a multitude of Wreck Beach battles. And buttressing his support always, was his tower of strength, his beloved Johanna.

A kaleidoscope of images come to mind of Lee: The wonderful photo of him, Phineas and Johanna frolicking in a lush tropical pool, the one from a past *World Guide...*he and Johanna on the cover of *N* Magazine while they were at the INF Congress in Europe...his amazing sense of humor and great intelligence (he was so bemused by the fact that I raised 1500 crickets in my float home, that he gifted me with a solid silver cricket belt buckle which I still cherish.)...his impassioned speeches at TNS Gatherings, and his unyielding defense of naturism...Lee on the TNS naked bus tour of Europe (but particularly his naked grocery shopping in Cap d'Agde). It was my great honor to have been awarded the 2006 Baxandall Naturist Leadership Award "in recognition of exceptional volunteer service on behalf of naturism.."

Lee has left us an unparalleled naturist legacy, but above all, his love and loyalty made him our great friend. Lucky us!

We are forever indebted, Lee. We salute you with love, Judy and Your Wreck Beach Family


